
Our selection will consist of a few examples of complete or virtually complete manuscripts, including appealing Books of Hours and a fancifully illuminated Breviary; individual leaves include examples from across Western Europe, comprised of a variety of texts and displaying a range of scripts, decorative motifs, and illumination.


